Concepts: quarter, eighth note rhythms, create actions, loud-quiet, high-low, m sl, fast-slow

Objectives:

- I can sing and move to music
- I can read rhythms and solfa notes
- I can perform high/low, loud/quiet, fast/slow in a song
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Songs/Activities:

- Sing and play along to "I Like Singin'" (review)
- Listen and learn the song "Missus Tong" to review high/low, loud/quiet, fast/slow
- Learn to sing and play the game, "Plainsies Clapsies"
- Name the solfa notes in the song, "Plainsies Clapsies"
- Review the song "I'm Glad I'm Back at School."

Teaching Procedure

Activity #2: Make a home-made kazoo and play along with "I Like Singin'"

To make a home-made kazoo you will need

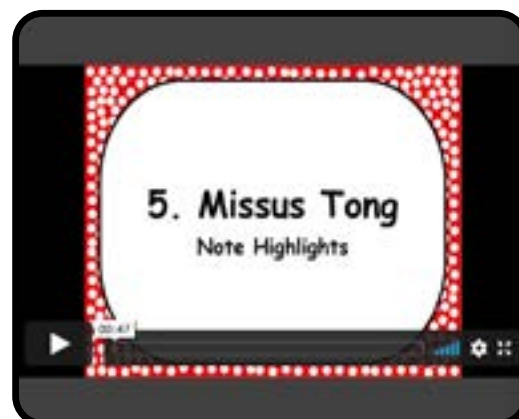
- a piece of wax paper or parchment paper 6"x6" or 16cm x16cm
- an elastic band
- an empty toilet paper roll

(It went fast, slow, loud, quiet, high and low)

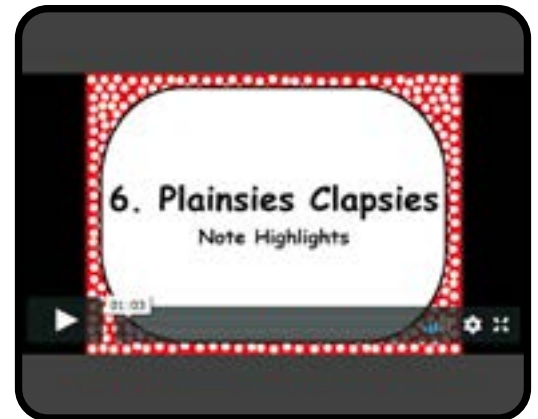
Play the song again and sing along!
