Concepts: beat, half and whole notes and rests, woodwind family, describe, mood, play along, low Ia and so

Objectives:

- I can sing and play with music
- I can listen to and reflect on music
- I can identify instrument families (woodwind)

Songs/Activities:

- review #25 "Nothing But Peace"
- poison rhythm with half, whole notes
- review #26 "Remember Flanders"
- Learn #30. "Children Together" - listen, reflect, sing
- play poison melody - mrd
- sing and play #31. "Long Legged Sailor" - read solfa
- Listen 3 #8: Leger - complete listening log - learn about the woodwinds
- Thanksgiving options: #10 Turkey Lurkey, #15 I'm Thankful, Unit

Teaching Procedure

Activity #1: Review the song, "Nothing but Peace"

Listen to and sing the song, "Nothing but Peace"



Activity #2: Watch the video, then practice pattern 1 for "Nothing but Peace"

Use buckets or desks, and learn pattern 1 for "Nothing but Peace"

Use sticks or dowels if you have them. If not, use two markers or pens to play the patterns.

If using desks, the top = top of the desk
side = side of the desk
rim = edge of the desk
click = click sticks

Watch the video, then practice pattern one for "Nothing but Peace"

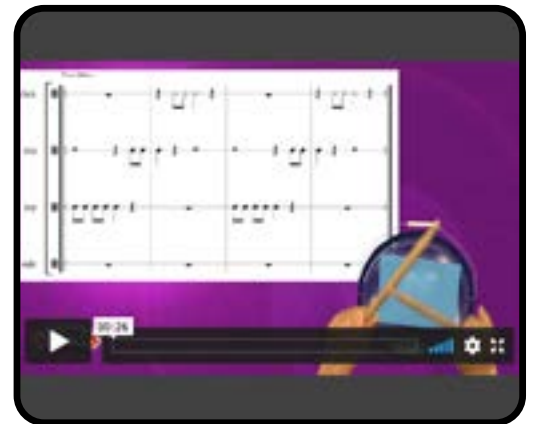
Practice several times, until you are confident.

Use buckets or desks, and learn pattern 2 for "Nothing but Peace"

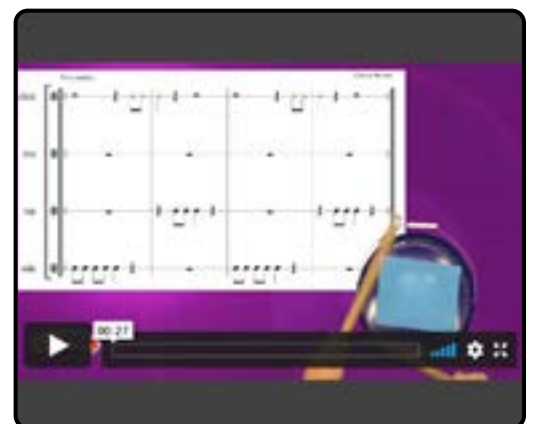
Watch the video, then practice the pattern.

Activity #6: Review the song, "Remember Flanders Fields"

Review the song, "Remember Flanders Fields"

Discuss with the students what the song is about.
- On Nov. 11th, what do you do to show that you remember our Veterans?"

Play the video again and sing along.



Activity #7: Learn song #30 "Children Together"

Listen to song #30 "Children Together"

Discuss with the students what they think the song is about.

Play the video again, and sing along with the chorus.



Activity #8: Listen to the selection, “Leger” and complete a listening log

You can print the listening log from “supporting resources” or answer the questions on a piece of paper.

Activity #11: Watch the kids demo for "Turkey Lurkey"

Adapt the game for Zoom: invite one child to run back and forth in front of their device camera while you sing the song. The rest of the class counts how many times they saw the "turkey."

Adapt the game for in-person: Go outside and play the chase game as a race game. Some teachers have been allowed to use a pool noodle to "tag" kids with. If you have enough noodles so students do not have to share, you could try the game as a chase game.

Activity #13: Thanksgiving Option - Thanksgiving Unit

In the Thanksgiving Unit there are several activities for Grade 3:

1. teach the song, "We are Thankful Children"
- you could teach this song in place of #25, 26, or 30
2. Thanksgiving Wishes poem
- there are two options for creating an accompaniment. a) note highlights and b) ostinato
3. Word Rhythm Activity using Thanksgiving words.
The first uses just 2 words, the second uses more words. Choose the activity that fits best with your students reading level
